Swim-Up Suite	Couples & luxury seekers	Direct pool access from your private patio.
Club / Preferred Level	Travelers wanting extra perks	Private lounges, upgraded amenities, premium locations.
Butler Suite	Special occasions	Personal butler service, luxury accommodations, and VIP treatment.
