Your Carry-On Strategy

What Should Stay With You?

Keep these items in your carry-on:

- Passport or government-issued identification
- Cruise card (until you leave the terminal)
- Wallet, cash, and credit cards
- Medications and medical devices
- Cell phone, chargers, and electronics
- Travel documents, flight confirmations, and transportation details
- Keys, glasses, and other personal essentials

Dress for the Journey Home

Choose comfortable clothing and shoes for travel. Remember that you may be walking through a large cruise terminal, waiting for transportation, or spending several hours at an airport before reaching home.

Stay Organized

Use a backpack or small rolling bag that keeps everything together and easy to access. Having your important documents and valuables in one place helps reduce stress while moving through the terminal and customs.
