If Something Goes Wrong

Even the best-planned vacations can encounter unexpected challenges. A delayed flight, a misplaced passport, or a medical emergency doesn't have to ruin your trip. Knowing what to do ahead of time can help you respond quickly and confidently.

Common Travel Emergencies

Situation	Recommended Action
Lost or Stolen Passport	Report it immediately and contact the nearest U.S. embassy or consulate.
Missed Flight	Contact your airline and travel advisor as soon as possible.
Missed Cruise Departure	Contact the cruise line immediately to discuss options for rejoining the ship.
Medical Emergency	Seek medical care and contact your travel insurance provider if applicable.
Lost Luggage	File a report with the airline before leaving the airport.

Keep Important Numbers Handy

Save the phone numbers for your travel advisor, cruise line, airline, travel insurance provider, and emergency contacts in your phone before leaving home. Having this information readily available can save valuable time during an emergency.

Travel Insurance Can Help

Depending on your policy, travel insurance may provide assistance for trip interruptions, medical emergencies, lost baggage, and emergency transportation. Review your policy before departure so you understand your coverage.

If something unexpected happens while you're traveling, don't panic—and don't assume you're on your own. Reach out to your travel advisor as soon as possible. I may be able to help you find solutions, coordinate with suppliers, or point you in the right direction while you focus on staying

safe.
