Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Do I need a passport for every cruise?

Not always. Some closed-loop cruises departing from and returning to the same U.S. port may allow other approved documentation. However, a passport is strongly recommended for almost every international cruise.

Q: How early should I renew my passport?

Check your passport as soon as you book your trip. Many destinations require at least six months of validity beyond your travel dates.

Q: What is the difference between a REAL ID and a passport?

A REAL ID is primarily for domestic identification and flights within the United States. A passport is required for most international travel.

Q: How do I know if I need an ETA or e-Visa?

Requirements depend on your citizenship and destination. Always verify current requirements through official government sources before traveling.

Q: Should I carry paper copies of my documents?

Yes. Carry printed copies along with secure digital copies stored on your phone or in cloud storage.

Q: Can my travel advisor help me?

Absolutely! While travelers are responsible for obtaining required documents, your travel advisor can help you understand the requirements, answer questions, and point you toward reliable resources.
