■ Fall	Fall colors, wine harvests, comfortable temperatures.	Excellent value after peak summer.
■ Christmas Markets	Festive markets, holiday lights, mulled wine, seasonal traditions.	Quite cold weather; book early.

Water Levels Matter

Unlike ocean cruises, river cruises can occasionally be affected by unusually high or low water levels caused by weather. Cruise lines work hard to minimize disruptions, but itinerary adjustments or ship changes can occasionally occur.
